I. Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 4:43 p.m.

Present were committee members: John Tyler, Allison Mendel, Sean Smith (on Zoom), Catherine Greenspan (on Zoom), and Emily Simon (on Zoom).

Also present were council liaison Jeff Dahle (on Zoom), and staff liaison Kerrick Gooden.

Also present were guests Brandon Polanco (pending formal appointment), Trina Stout (with Rogue Valley Migra Watch), and Erika Martin (with Unite Oregon).

1. IV. Unfinished Business

1. Regional ICE activity - discussion: should SERJAC issue a recommendation to Council regarding a proclamation similar to [Coos Bay's Press Release from March 2, 2026](#). (Discussion 20 minutes)

The committee reviewed its discussion from the last meeting about efforts in Coos Bay opposing the development on an ICE facility there, and the committee's decision to draft a similar proclamation (to Coos Bay's Press Release from March 2, 2026) as a recommendation to the Ashland City Council for adoption. The working group discussed its first draft with Mayor Graham who provided constructive feedback. The committee discussed the urgency of this recommendation due to recent reports of increased local ICE activity.

After discussion and amendment, the following motion was adopted:

Simon moved to authorize Simon and Greenspan to move forward as a working group to incorporate feedback into the committee's draft proclamation, and to schedule an emergency meeting by electronic attendance next Thursday, June 11, 2026 to review and decide on issuing a recommendation to the Ashland City Council for adoption. Tyler seconded the motion. All ayes. The motion passed.

2. Link to recently updated [Immigration Resources Page](#) on the City of Ashland website
Guests spoke that local monitoring of ICE activity has increased and that such reporting has been proactive, swift and effective. The committee asked what it could do in support. Guests replied that Rogue Valley Migra Watch is always looking for volunteers to support its ongoing rapid response: the next training is June 15, 2026 from 6:00-8:30 p.m with details forthcoming at Rogue Valley Migra Watch on Facebook or Instagram.

Guests commented that the City's Immigration Resource page was helpful, but suggested updating inaccurate contact information:

The Northwest Seasonal Workers Association website should be listed as: <https://nswamedford.org/> with a phone number of 541-773-6811; the correct phone number for UNETE should be listed as 541-245-1625; and the correct phone number for Coalicion Fortaleza should be 541-236-5605.

It was also suggested that UNETE, Rogue Valley Migra Watch, and Coalicion Fortaleza may all be willing to collaborate on the committee's proclamation or any other efforts. The committee discussed the importance of attending the training by Migra Watch, and an announcement was made that the next Northwest Seasonal Workers event will be a Luau on July 18th, 2026 at 6:00pm with invitation and more information extended in-person as requested.

Mendel - requested committee members let the staff liaison know if they have something to report ahead of agenda creation to support accurate agenda planning. This will be critical when moving to quarterly meetings (to be discussed in the next agenda item).

Greenspan - Planning Commission - nothing of consequence to report.

Tyler - TAC - Unable to attend - did not receive a link to attend the electronic meeting and so reached out to Gooden for follow-up. TAC support responded that they will ensure future invitations are sent.

Simon - PAAC - Did not attend the meeting - PAAC has been working on Playwrights Walk Plaques, among other things - no concerns.

Mendel - HHSAC - Was unable to attend - no concerns.

Smith - Parks - nothing of consequence to report.

Smith - CoCoConvo - Smith shared (at CoCoConvo) about SERJAC efforts to collaborate with other committees. Other discussion included the potential for advisory committee booths at the 4th of July parade event, a report that Micah BlackLight's sculpture (Ancestor's Future: Crystallizing Our Call) was fully funded, a plan for installation of the second Guanajuato Heart is coming, and Garfield Park and Night Lawn issues were discussed.

The committee discussed its history related to marching in the July 4th parade: originally this was something the SERJAC participated in, but then the committee decided not to march. The committee discussed the idea of marching with the July 4 parade and/or having a booth to encourage advisory committee participation this year. Discussion included the difference of marching, tabling, and what to focus on if meetings are being reduced to quarterly.

VI. New Business

1. Committee Organization (Discussion: 5-15 min. - Co-Chairs and Gooden)

Co-Charis Mendel and Smith spoke of their recent meeting with City Manager Cotta regrading a phased change for SERJAC (along with PAAC and HPAC) to quarterly meetings, beginning after its July meeting, due to staff and resource strain. After its July meeting, the schedule will be quarterly meetings in January, April, July, and October with committee workplans being discussed at the last City Council Study Session of the year.

Concern was expressed about not feeling valued, what other committees are moving to quarterly, and if this change will diminish SERJAC's effectiveness. The committee discussed and was in agreement that quarterly meetings were inadequate. Discussions included how to communicate the will of the committee to continue as-is, and consideration was given to speak during the public forum at the next regular business meeting of the City Council.
