I. CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 11:08am.

1. Early Learning Council Panel Presentation Debrief

Hyatt reported on this discussion from Oct 29 when Ashland shared its work as part of the panel.

Ashland has access issues for infant and toddler care with challenges for those that need full-time care. The needle has moved in Ashland more than the County on this and much of this is due to YMCA investment.

The biggest challenge for Ashland is staffing and burnout to maintain slots that are already up and running. 2/3 of providers have been injured on the job from challenging behaviors. Payscale is low while behaviors get worse -providers are exiting this profession and those staying work 2-3 jobs to make ends meet.

Committee discussed wanting this funding stream to continue in City budget come March- and the need for metrics of what was accomplished, new seats online, and socio-economic benefits. Hyatt will ask partners for anecdotal information.

Committee discussed other potential funding such as the Community Development Block Grant.
